Selective bias

Laurent Le Pierres, in his column "Deep-seated prejudice or well-founded wariness?" (Aug. 20), throws in a senseless and unbalanced comment attacking the Palestinians for "suicide bombings and all manner of depraved acts."

The abhorrent, rare suicide bombings carried out against innocent civilians, by a few misguided Palestinians, are minuscule compared to the massive war crimes committed against them, continuously, by the Israeli authorities.
